### TOWN OF CHARLOTTE COUNTY OF CHAUTAUQUA STATE OF NEW YORK



The Town Board, Town of Charlotte held a regular Board Meeting on Wednesday, May 13<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Highway Department Garage as well as a teleconference call. All information on the change in venue was published in a legal notice on May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Mr. Allen Chase, Supervisor presiding. Board members present were: Darren Carlstrom, Harold North, Mark Jaquith, and Mark Abbey. Others present were: Mark LeBaron, Highway Superintendent, Sherman Sweeney and Susan L. Peacock, Town Clerk. Present via live teleconference: Town Residents John Conway and Beverly LeBaron.

The meeting was called to order.

Prayer was offered by Mark Abbey followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. An American Flag was donated by Warren Draggett and Gay-Mark Tire & Wheel.

Each board member had been given a copy of the minutes of the April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020 board meeting. A motion was made by Mark Abbey, seconded by Darren Carlstrom and with none opposed it carried to accept the minutes as submitted.

A motion was made by Harold North, seconded by Mark Jaquith and with none opposed it carried to draw warrants on the proper funds in payment of Highway Claims No. 71 to No. 86 in the amount of \$6,495.91 which have been duly audited and to draw warrants on the proper funds in payment of General Fund Claims No. 132 to No. 152 in the amount of \$8846.66 which have been duly audited.

A motion was made by Darren Carlstrom, seconded by Harold North and with none opposed it carried to accept the April 2020 Financial Report prepared for the Town of Charlotte by Bahgat Laurito & Bahgat,

A motion was made by Mark Abbey, seconded by Mark Jaquith and with none opposed it carried to set Board of Assessment Review for May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 from 4-8pm compensating \$90 to each BOAR Member: Amanda Chase, Sue Oakes, Ron Pavlock. Due to COVID-19 regulations the Board of Assessment Review will only be taking appointments by phone.

A motion was made by Darren Carlstrom, seconded by Harold North and with none opposed it carried to authorize Mark LeBaron, Highway Superintendent, to purchase a

A motion was made by Mark Jaquith, seconded by Mark Abbey and with none opposed it carried to authorize Mark LeBaron, Highway Superintendent, to purchase a TOWMASTER T-12DT 2020 Trailer from Monroe Tractor, Buffalo, NY in the amount of \$9,824.20.

A motion was made by Mark Abbey, seconded by Harold North and with none opposed it carried to authorize Allen Chase, Town Supervisor, to pay GHD invoice #78378 dated 3/28/20 in the amount of \$11,909.50 out of the escrow account funded entirely by Innogy. This is at no cost to the Town in any way.

A motion was made by Mark Jaquith, seconded by Mark Abbey and with none opposed it carried to authorize Allen Chase, Town Supervisor, to pay GHD invoice #78820 dated 4/25/20 in the amount of \$6,656.50 out of the escrow account funded entirely by Innogy. This is at no cost to the Town in any way.

A motion was made by Darren Carlstrom, seconded by Harold North and with none opposed it carried to authorize Susan L. Peacock, Town Clerk, to schedule the Port-O-Let for the Town Playground and Ball Field when COVID-19 regulations lift and the facilities will be allowed for use.

Discussion was heard on the following:

1. **JUSTICE REPORT:** Written Information on the ongoing COVID regulations. The Court Clerk and Justice are now allowed back into their offices to file paperwork and begin going through emails and voice mails. The Governor has banned evictions through August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

#### 2. **HIGHWAY REPORT**:

- 1. Graded Dirt Roads.
- 2. Cutting ash trees and other dead trees on East and Cleland Roads.
- 3. Freightliner had to be pulled from Palmyra Auction, Truck was fixed on 5/12, will try Teitsworth June auction.
- 4. Patched parking lot at Highway barns. Roads are swept, intersections smoothed out.
- 5. Servicing trucks and cleaning up plow equipment.

- 6. Clean up day was busiest ever. Containers almost full by noon.
- 7. Received 3 Bids for an asphalt Roller. Received a quote for a tilt trailer on state bid for roller.
- 8. Would like to discuss having a plan in place for the anticipated loss of sales tax revenue that will affect Road projects this summer.
- 3. **CLERK REPORT:** April scheduled hours were 38 with 43 hours actually worked leaving the total amount of 5 hours over the scheduled hours. On May 1, 2020 the decibel meter was returned to the Town after being on loan to the Town of Gerry. A Thank You card was received from the Valley Historical Society thanking the Town for their continued support. A Quarterly Sales Tax Update was received from the County stating the following:

"Today, the County received the second Sales Tax distribution for this month from the State. The payment consists of the balance of sales tax collected on economic activity in March for businesses that report monthly.

Today's distribution is <36.61>% LESS than last year.

Quarter-to-date revenues are now <30.43>% LESS compared to last year.

A quote was received from DFT Communications for a printer and laptop computers for the Highway Building in the amount of \$1,485.96. It is within the Town's procurement policy guidelines and was ordered. I, as well as Matthew Riggle, Deputy Town Clerk, continue to work several hours from home. The following report was presented:
